For example, the Work Habits skill set may include skills such as Follows Directions, Works Independently, and Uses Time Wisely.

Non-Mailing Report Card	Select to print a version of the report card that will not be mailed out. The student’s mailing address is omitted to allow more data to print on one page.

Conference Requested Line	Select to print a check box on the report card to allow the parent to indicate that he wishes to schedule a conference. If selected, the check box prints below the signature with the message “check to request conference.”																				
Promoted/Retained Message on last report card of the year	<p>Select to print the “Promoted” or “Retained” message on the report card for the last cycle of the last semester. The message will only print for the final semester-cycle, even if it is selected for an earlier semester-cycle.</p> <p>The message displayed depends on the student's year-end-status code. For example, if a student's end-of-year status code indicates that he is retained pending completion of summer school, the message will indicate that status. Use Quarterly Display	Select if you use nine-week grading cycles and want the report card to print quarters 1-4 (instead of cycles 1-4) and do not want to display semester numbers.																				

Select the letter, number, and word recognition skill sets to include:

Print Letter Grid	Select to include the letter grid, which indicates the student’s alphabet letter recognition skills, such as recognizing upper- and lower-case letters. If selected, teachers will use Grades > Elementary Report Cards > Elementary Letter Skills to track the student’s progress.
Print Number Grid	Select to include the number grid, which indicates the student’s recognition of and ability to write numbers. If selected, teachers will use Grades > Elementary Report Cards > Elementary Number Skills to track the student’s progress.
Print High Frequency Word List	Select to include the high frequency word grid, which indicates the student’s recognition of common words. If selected, teachers will use Grades > Elementary Report Cards > Elementary Word Skills to track the student’s progress.
Print Color Word Recognition	Select to include the color word recognition grid, which indicates the student’s recognition of color words. If selected, teachers will use Grades > Elementary Report Cards > Elementary Word Skills to track the student’s progress.
Print Rote Counting	Select to include the rote counting skill set grid, which indicates the student’s rote counting abilities. If selected, teachers will use Grades > Elementary Report Cards > Elementary Number Skills) to track the student’s progress.

	Attendance Period	Select the period to use for reporting attendance on the report card: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Report Card Period</i> - Attendance will be calculated based on the period for which the report card is being printed. For example, if the report card is printed for a fifth period reading class, attendance will be pulled for fifth period only. This is the default setting. • <i>ADA Period</i> - When the report card is printed, the program will determine what the ADA period is for each student's attendance track and only count absences incurred during that period.
	Tardy Period	Select the period to use for reporting tardies on the report card. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Report Card Period</i> - Tardies will be calculated based on the period for which the report card is being printed. For example, if the report card is printed for a fifth period reading class, tardies will be pulled for fifth period only. This is the default setting. • <i>ADA Period</i> - When the report card is printed, the program will determine what the ADA period is for each student's attendance track and only count tardies incurred during that period. If a particular period is used for reporting tardies at the elementary level, you can select the period. This may or may not be the ADA period.



Report cards are designed to print with the parent/guardian address positioned so that it appears in the window of a standard envelope if the paper is folded into thirds. (This also applies to elementary skills-based IPRs printed via [Grades > Elementary Report Cards > Print Elementary Report Card](#).)

Background colors may not automatically print, depending on your browser settings. For more information, [click here](#).

Before printing report cards or IPRs, you may want to change the Page Setup options to enable or disable printing of headers and footers. **Be aware** that if the headers and footers are disabled, page numbers are not printed, and there is a risk of the report pages (i.e., the actual papers) getting out of order inadvertently. This could potentially result in a student receiving the wrong subsequent pages of the report card or IPR if there are multiple pages. However, you may want the headers and footers disabled for a neater appearance.

The semester and cycle are displayed at the top of the IPR. However, the final scores and calculated average are cumulative for the semester.

For standards-based courses, the following is included on a student’s IPR:

A - Conversion Grade: The grade that appears on Grades > Cycle Grades in the Average column is displayed. It is the student’s average to date. The average is cumulative for the semester, even though assignment grades are only displayed for the selected semester-cycle.

B - Standard Set: The set of standards with which the graded standard is associated is displayed.

C - Standard: The standard is displayed.

D - Assignment Name: The assignment associated with the standard is displayed. The grade for each assignment is displayed in the grade column. The assignment grades are displayed for the selected semester-cycle only.

 - If an override grade is entered, the override grade is always displayed.

F - Final Score (standard set): A final score is displayed for each standard set. This is the average of all final scores for each standard. The final standard set score reflects standard set scores for all cycles in the semester, even though only one cycle is displayed at a time. The average does not include scores of zero, unless zero is a valid grade for the campus. The final standard set score is rounded to one decimal place.

G - Total Score: This average of all standard set final scores is displayed, which takes into account all cycles in the semester. This grade is converted to a standard 100%-based grade using a conversion chart established by the district (e.g., 3/80, where 3 is the student's total score, and 80 is the student's converted grade).
